### Required Quarantine Period

Your foster pet should be quarantined from any other pets for a minimum of 5-7 days to prevent the spread of potential illnesses. This can be in a crate, or in a separate room/area in your home. Fosters will also have to go through the required quarantine period before attending events.

### Crate Training

We highly recommend crating your foster pet (except for eating, potty, and/or play time) for the first few days until he/she is acclimated to their new environment. We find this strict restroom schedule of - morning, afternoon, evening, and before bed - accustoms your foster to a schedule and connect outside with potty-time and it has proven to be the easiest method for getting your foster house-trained.

### Help your foster pet become the best dog that he or she can b

- We encourage you to work with your foster to establish good “pet-tiquette” by enforcing basic rules, and rewarding positive behaviors and teaching basic commands. A well-rounded “fur-individual” is a highly desirable candidate for adoption! Knowing how to walk well on a leash is also a plus! ### Medical Info

- Your foster is spayed, or neutered, and fully vaccinated before entering your home and has received a flea and tick, and heartworm preventative that lasts for 30 days from their last dose and you can find this on their medical paperwork.
